# **Ocular Surgery Instructions**

### **Prior to Surgery**

- 1. If you take aspirin, Advil, Coumadin, or Plavix, please inform Dr. Miller two (2) weeks before your surgery.
- 2. DO NOT eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery.
- 3. If you take medication for heart conditions and/or high blood pressure, please take it as usual the morning of surgery with a small sip of water.
- 4. If you take medication for diabetes, DO NOT take it the morning of surgery.
- 5. The hospital will call you several days before your surgery to schedule an appointment for pre-operative lab and paperwork.
- 6. If you feel ill on the morning of surgery or need to cancel the procedure for any reason, call Dr. Miller's office as soon as possible.
- 7. Please feel free to call Dr. Miller's office with any questions.
- 8. Antibiotic drops (Vigamox or Zymar):
  - Beginning two (2) day prior to surgery, place one (1) drop in the eye four (4) times per day;
  - On the day of surgery, place one (1) drop in the eye prior to coming to the hospital.

## **After Surgery**

- 1. You may take Tylenol or Motrin as needed for discomfort.
- 2. Keep your shield on until your first post-op appointment the day after surgery and Dr. Miller will remove it for you.
- 3. Bring all eye medications to your appointment the day after surgery.

#### **Medications**

**Prednisilone:** (Omnipred or Pred Forte)- (to begin the day after surgery):

Place one (1) drop in the operated eye every two (2) hours, while you are awake, for one (1) week;

Then place one (1) drop in the eye four (4) times per day for one (1) week;

Then place one (1) drop in the eye three (3) times per day for one (1) week;

Then place one (1) drop in the eye two (2) times per day for one (1) week;

Then place one (1) drop in the eye one (1) time per day for one (1) week;

Then stop using the drop.

#### Vigamox/Zymar:

Beginning two (2) days prior to surgery, place one (1) drop in the eye four (4) times per day;

On the day of surgery, place one (1) drop in the eye prior to coming to the hospital;

Beginning the day after surgery, place one (1) drop in the eye four (4) times per day for one (1) week; then stop using the drop.

#### **Ointment:** (to begin the day after surgery):

Apply the ointment to the operated eye before going to bed for one (1) week then stop using the ointment.

#### Shield:

Tape the shield over the operated eye before sleeping and keep the shield on until you wake for two (2) weeks.

#### Possible Reactions After Surgery

**Normal Reactions:** It is normal for the eye to be red, sensitive to light, have blurred vision, tear, and have mild irritation especially when blinking.

**Abnormal Reactions:** If you experience persistent pain, sudden loss of vision, or anything that you think is unusual, please call Dr. Miller's office immediately.

## **Eye Care After Surgery**

**Vision:** Check your vision each day without your glasses. If you notice a sudden decrease in vision, please call Dr. Miller's office.

**Eye Discharge:** To remove eye discharge, gently clean the eye with sterile gauze or a clean wash cloth that has been moistened with warm water.

#### Other Information

- 1. Don't be afraid to use your eye. You can feel free to read or watch T.V. as much as you would like.
- 2. You may take a shower or a bath, but try to avoid getting soapy water in the eye.
- 3. Please ask Dr. Miller about driving.
- 4. DO NOT rub the eye, lift any objects over twenty (20) pounds, perform any strenuous activities or bend your head below your waist for three weeks.
